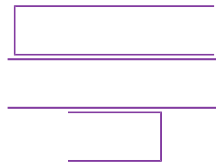


# Pet Nutrition

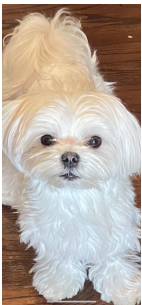
3 main benefits from feeding a complete and balanced whole food diet to pets
